We have the tools to help you make smart choices today to better ensure a clean environment and plentiful energy supplies for years to come. Simple changes in your daily routine using the no- and low-cost conservation tips below can add up to big energy savings. And, you'll save money in the process!

Reduce hot water usage by lowering the temperature of your hot water heater to 120 degrees, washing clothes in cold water and taking a short shower instead of a bath.

Use kitchen and bath ventilating fans sparingly in cold weather as they can blow warm inside air out.

Keep preheat time to a minimum with conventional ovens. Only preheat when baking, not broiling or roasting.

Use the moisture sensor feature on your dryer to avoid over drying clothes. Over drying wastes energy, causes shrinkage and shortens the life of your clothes.

When using a dishwasher, wash only full loads and let them air-dry. Open the door after the final rinse to expedite drying.

Stand Up and Be Counted!

Why is the U.S. Census so important?

Data collected during the census is used to determine the resources allocated to your community over the next 10 years. More than \$4 trillion will be spent throughout the next decade on infrastructure such as roads, bridges, tunnels and other public works projects.

Funding to schools, hospitals, emergency services, job training programs and senior centers is also determined by census data. And, census information establishes the numbers of seats New Jersey will hold in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Starting in March 2010, census forms will be delivered to every residence in our country. The form, with only 10 short questions, must be completed and mailed back in the postage-paid return envelope. If you do not return the form, a census taker will visit your home to obtain the necessary information. Any personal data provided is protected under federal law.

So stand up and be counted – the future of your community is in your hands!
